Priorities for K-8

- Increase the number of district-funded seats
- Have a laser-like focus on academic recovery in literacy and mathematics.
- Offer full day programs for six weeks (Monday - Thursday).
- Include enrichment (e.g. art, music, dance), field trips, and/or science and technology opportunities.
- Support tutoring opportunities embedded in the schedule ²

Priorities for 9-12

- Expand opportunities for students in grade 9-12 to earn credits during the summer and related to college and career
- Prioritize scholars who are working to earn credits from unfinished learning
- Support tutoring opportunities for students

23 in-Person

Wednesday Family Workshops

3 hours enrichment

Students engage in personalized, small group reading instruction, paired with weekly opportunities to learn alongside their families during family workshops as well as resources to support families at home reading progress for overall student reading growth.

In 2021, Springboard served 28 schools and over 2,000 students and families during summer programming with City Schools. In just 5 weeks, 85% of students increased at least one literacy proficiency band in the DIBELS assessment. Families were also eager to participate: overall family workshop attendance rate was 90%.
