Engagement Data


- 117 programs and group meetings

- Member Attendees 285 individuals representing 89 organizations = 70% of member orgs
- Non-Member Attendees 337 individuals representing 206 organizations
- Non-Member Speakers 262 individuals representing 181 organizations


TYPES OF PROGRAMS






Member Survey and Program Impact Survey Highlights


Agree accounts for the majority of 'Member Services: MPN delivers quality programs, consultation, resources, and knowledge to members'.

Most Beneficial Programs


- The "most beneficial programs" were said to have these qualities:

Least Useful Programs

- The "least Useful programs" were said to have these qualities:
 - Lack of vibrant discussion;
 - Information was too advanced or too elementary;
 - did not include discussions with peers about how we can work together on the issue; or
 - too few perspectives represented.






